Opinion

1. General Information

Arrow Community Enterprise CLG is a company limited by guarantee incorporated in Ireland. Ballinafad, Co. Sligo is the registered office, which is also the principal place of business of the company. The Company is a community based company which was formed to promote, foster, improve and develop the Lough Arrow, Co. Sligo region and surrounding areas through co-ordinating all the interested parties and acting as a representative body for all those seeking to improve and enhance the economic potential of the region. The Company has let the premises it owns at Ballinafad, Co. Sligo, and rental income is their main source of income. The financial statements have been presented in Euro (€) which is also the functional currency of the company.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the year ended 30 April 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of FRS 102 Section 1A (Small Entities) and the Companies Act 2014.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention except for certain properties and financial instruments that are measured at revalued amounts or fair values, as explained in the accounting policies below. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" Section 1A, issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

The company qualifies as a small company as defined by section 280A of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Small Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280C of the Companies Act 2014 and Section 1A of FRS 102.

Income

Turnover comprises the invoice value of goods supplied by the company, exclusive of trade discounts and value added tax.

Tangible assets and depreciation

Tangible assets are stated at cost or at valuation, less accumulated depreciation. The charge to depreciation is calculated to write off the original cost or valuation of tangible assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives as follows:

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed annually for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable. The directors carried out a review the carrying value of fixed assets and there is no indication of impairment at the date of signing of the financial statements.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and in hand, demand deposits with banks and other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and bank overdrafts. In the Balance Sheet bank overdrafts are shown within Creditors.

Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs relating to the acquisition of assets are capitalised at the appropriate rate by adding them to the cost of assets being acquired. Investment income earned on the temporary investment of specific borrowings pending their expenditure on the assets is deducted from the borrowing costs eligible for capitalisation. All other borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred.

Trade and other creditors

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

Taxation

This company is exempt from taxation under section 207 of the Taxes Consolidation Act 1997 as it has charitable status (CHY13072).

Government Grants

Capital grants received and receivable are treated as deferred income and amortised to the Income and Expenditure Account annually over the useful economic life of the asset to which it relates. Revenue grants are credited to the Income and Expenditure Account when received.

3. Going concern

The directors are required to assess the company's ability to trade as a going concern. The company is dependent on rental income. The Board have prepared forecasts for 2025/2026 to monitor revenue and costs. Based on these forecasts the directors are confident that the company will continue in existence for the foreseeable future and have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis.

4. Provisions Available for Audits of Small Entities

In common with many other businesses of our size and nature, we use our auditors to prepare and submit tax returns to the Revenue and to assist with the preparation of the financial statements.

All monies loaned from Allied Irish Banks are charged over title deeds of properties owned by the company.

The company owns a property The National Field Study Centre at Ballinafad Co. Sligo. The National Field Study Centre at Ballinafad consists of 9 acres approx. 1 acre is registered in the name of the company and the balance i.e. approx 8 acres relating to the National Field Study Centre is held under a 999 year lease from the Bishop of Elphin Diocese.

The Property asset at Ballinafad Field Study Centre, Co. Sligo has been professionally valued by Vincent Egan, IPAV, Elphin Street, Boyle, Co. Roscommon at 10th April 2013 and was valued at €460,000.

The carrying amount of the property at 31 December 2025 is €296,000 (2024: €304,000). This excludes any additions to Land & Buildings subsequent to the valuation. The directors have reviewed the property's estimated fair value at the reporting date, taking into account market conditions and comparable transactions, and are satisfied that the fair value is not lower than the carrying amount.

As the carrying amount is below the most recent valuation and the directors consider that it does not differ materially from fair value at the reporting date, no revaluation adjustment has been recognised in the current year.

No impairment loss has been recognised.
