The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 May 2025.

Principal Activity and Review of the Business

The principal activity of the company is to establish, promote, operate and market the village of Ballyfarnon. The company also oversees the operation of the childcare facility which services the surrounding area. There has been no significant changes in these activities during the financial year.

The Company is limited by guarantee not having a share capital.

There has been no significant change in these activities during the financial year ended 31 May 2025.

Financial Results

The surplus for the financial year after providing for depreciation amounted to €1,450 (2024 - €8,566).

At the end of the financial year, the company has assets of €165,921 (2024 - €172,393) and liabilities of €110,331 (2024 - €118,253). The net assets of the company have increased by €1,450.

The auditors, Moran McNamara, (Chartered Accountants), continue in office in accordance with section 383(2) of the Companies Act 2014.

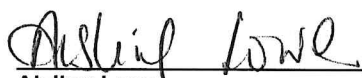
Statement on Relevant Audit Information

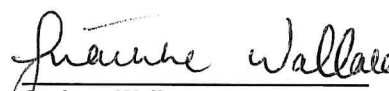
Accounting Records

The directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable Irish law and regulations.

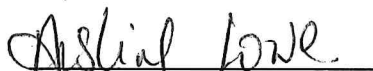

In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

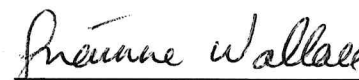
- select suitable accounting policies for the company financial statements and then apply them consistently;

INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

to the Members of Ballyfarnon Community Enterprise Group CLG

Report on the audit of the financial statements

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Ballyfarnon Community Enterprise Group CLG ('the company') for the financial year ended 31 May 2025 which comprise the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet, the Statement of Changes in Equity and the related notes to the financial statements, including the summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 2. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is Irish Law and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland", issued in the United Kingdom by the Financial Reporting Council, applying Section 1A of that Standard.

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the assets, liabilities and financial position of the company as at 31 May 2025 and of its surplus for the financial year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland", applying Section 1A of that Standard; and
- have been properly prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2014.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (Ireland) (ISAs (Ireland)) and applicable law. Our responsibilities under those standards are described below in the Auditor's responsibilities for the audit of the financial statements section of our report. for the financial year ended 31 May 2025

1. General Information

Ballyfarnon Community Enterprise Group CLG is a company limited by guarantee incorporated and registered in Ireland. The registered number of the company is 371921. The registered office of the company is Ballyfarnon, Co Roscommon. The nature of the company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the Directors' Report. The financial statements have been presented in Euro (€) which is also the functional currency of the company.

2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the financial year ended 31 May 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of FRS 102 Section 1A (Small Entities) and the Companies Act 2014.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention except for certain properties and financial instruments that are measured at revalued amounts or fair values, as explained in the accounting policies below. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" Section 1A, issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

The company qualifies as a small company as defined by section 280A of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Small Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280C of the Companies Act 2014 and Section 1A of FRS 102.

Income

Income comprises of income from fundraising activities, donations, government grants received and other childcare fees .

Tangible assets and depreciation

Tangible assets are stated at cost or at valuation, less accumulated depreciation. The charge to depreciation is calculated to write off the original cost or valuation of tangible assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives as follows:

Land and buildings freehold	- 4% Straight line
Fixtures, fittings and equipment	- 15% Straight line

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed annually for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Trade and other creditors

Trade and other creditors are stated at cost.

Taxation

The company is a registered charity and also has tax exemption status under Section 207 of the Taxes Consolidation Act 1997 and is exempted from corporation tax with the Revenue commissioners. The company's registered charity number is 20058234 and its CHY number is 16270

Government grants

Capital grants received and receivable are treated as deferred income and amortised to the Income and Expenditure Account annually over the useful economic life of the asset to which it relates. Revenue grants are credited to the Income and Expenditure Account when received.

3. Significant accounting judgements and key sources of estimation uncertainty

Judgements

The directors consider the accounting assumptions below to be its significant accounting judgements:

Going concern:

The directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis and set out details of this information in note 5 to these financial statements.

Depreciation of fixed assets and amortisation of government grants is the key source of estimation used.

4. Departure from Companies Act 2014 Presentation

The directors have elected to present an Income and Expenditure Account instead of a Profit and Loss Account in these financial statements as this company is a not-for-profit entity.

5. Going concern

The directors have assessed a period of 12 months from the date of approving the financial statements with regard to the appropriateness of the going concern assumption in preparing the financial statements.

The company realised a surplus during the financial period. The funding continued from Pobal and the company also received various grants from Roscommon County Council for repairs to the community centre and purchase of a Defib for the community centre.

The company is continuing to seek government funding to upgrade and repair the community centre and also plan to rent out the community centre for summer camps and other social events in the future.

The directors state that they have considered the impact of the war in the Middle East and raising costs of energy on its finances and ability to continue as a going concern. The directors have confirmed that they do not envisage any change in core funding from Pobal going forward into 2026 and 2027 and that all employees will continue to be paid from funding received during the year.

For the reasons set out above, the directors of the company are of the view that it will have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future from the date of approval of these financial statements and they continue to adopt the going concern basis in the preparation of the financial statements.
