### 1. General Information

International Airline Marketing (Holdings) Limited is a company limited by shares incorporated and registered in Ireland. The registered number of the company is 691018. The registered office of the company is Unit 4-4a Manor Street Business Park, Manor Street, Dublin 7, Ireland. The principal activity of the Company is the holding of investments in subsidiary undertakings. The Company functions as a holding entity within the group and derives its income primarily from dividend income received from its subsidiaries. There were no significant changes in the nature of the Company's activities during the financial year. The financial statements have been presented in Euro (€) which is also the functional currency of the company.

### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

#### Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the financial year ended 31 December 2025 have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of FRS 102 Section 1A (Small Entities) and the Companies Act 2014.

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" Section 1A, issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

The company qualifies as a small company as defined by section 280A of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Small Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280C of the Companies Act 2014 and Section 1A of FRS 102.

#### Financial assets

Investments in subsidiary undertakings are stated at cost less impairment.

The carrying value of investments is reviewed for impairment if events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. If such indicators exist, the recoverable amount of the investment is estimated and any impairment loss is recognised in the profit and loss account.

Dividend income from subsidiary undertakings is recognised in the profit and loss account when the Company's right to receive payment is established, provided that it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the dividend will flow to the Company.

#### Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts except where the effect of discounting would be immaterial. In such cases the receivables are stated at cost less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

#### Trade and other creditors

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

### Taxation and deferred taxation

Current tax represents the amount expected to be paid or recovered in respect of taxable profits for the financial year and is calculated using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the Statement of Financial Position date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future, or a right to pay less tax in the future. Timing differences are temporary differences between the company's taxable profits and its results as stated in the financial statements.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are anticipated to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse, based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the Statement of Financial Position date.

### Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the Statement of Financial Position date. Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Non-monetary items that are measured at fair value in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the date when the fair value was determined. The resulting exchange differences are dealt with in the Income Statement.

### Ordinary share capital

The ordinary share capital of the company is presented as equity.

### 3. Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis. The directors have considered the financial performance and financial position of the Company's subsidiary undertakings and are satisfied that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future.

### 4. Provisions Available for Audits of Small Entities

In accordance with the provisions available for small entities, the auditors have provided certain non-audit services to the Company. These services include the preparation of the financial statements from the accounting records maintained by management, tax compliance services including the preparation and submission of corporation tax returns, and company secretarial services.

The directors acknowledge their responsibility for the preparation of the financial statements, including all accounting records and judgements used in their preparation, and for ensuring that the Company complies with the provisions of the Companies Act 2014.

The provision of these services is permitted under the relevant ethical standards applicable to auditors of small entities.
