## NOTES TO THE ABRIDGED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

for the financial year ended 31 May 2025

### 1. General Information

Bradshaw's Inn Limited is a company limited by shares incorporated in Ireland. Rhebogue, Mountshannon Road, Lisnagry, Co Limerick is the registered office, which is also the principal place of business of the company. The nature of the company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the Directors' Report. The financial statements have been presented in Euro (€) which is also the functional currency of the company.

### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company financial statements.

#### Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 105 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable to the Micro-Entities Regime" issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

The company qualifies as a micro company as defined by section 280D of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Micro Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280E of the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 105.

#### Turnover

Turnover comprises the invoice value of goods supplied by the company, exclusive of trade discounts and value added tax.

#### Tangible assets and depreciation

Tangible assets are stated at cost or at valuation, less accumulated depreciation. The charge to depreciation is calculated to write off the original cost or valuation of tangible assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives as follows:

Long leasehold property	-	10% Straight line
Fixtures, fittings and equipment	-	15% Straight line

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed annually for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Stocks are determined on a first-in first-out basis. Cost comprises expenditure incurred in the normal course of business in bringing stocks to their present location and condition. Full provision is made for obsolete and slow moving items. Net realisable value comprises actual or estimated selling price (net of trade discounts) less all further costs to completion or to be incurred in marketing and selling.

#### Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts except where the effect of discounting would be immaterial. In such cases the receivables are stated at cost less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

#### Borrowing costs

Borrowing costs relating to the acquisition of assets are capitalised at the appropriate rate by adding them to the cost of assets being acquired. Investment income earned on the temporary investment of specific borrowings pending their expenditure on the assets is deducted from the borrowing costs eligible for capitalisation. All other borrowing costs are recognised in profit or loss in the period in which they are incurred.

#### Trade and other creditors

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

**Taxation**

Current tax represents the amount expected to be paid or recovered in respect of taxable profits for the financial year and is calculated using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the Statement of Financial Position date.

**Government grants**

Capital grants received and receivable are treated as deferred income and amortised to the Income Statement annually over the useful economic life of the asset to which it relates. Revenue grants are credited to the Income Statement when received.

**Ordinary share capital**

The ordinary share capital of the company is presented as equity.

**Exceptional item**

Exceptional items are those that the directors' view are required to be separately disclosed by virtue of their size or incidence to enable a full understanding of the company's financial performance.

**4. Going concern**

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis which assumes that the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. In considering the going concern issue the board notes the reported loss of €47,153 (2024: Loss of €20,188) during the financial year and net current liabilities of (€35,983)(2024: €4,182) and net liabilities of (€63,058) (2024: Net liabilities €15,905) at the balance sheet date. Included in liabilities are directors loans in the sum of €65,849 and these will not be repaid until the company has adequate resources.

The going concern assumption of the company is dependent on the continued sourcing of additional funds, continued support from the directors, cost reduction programs and revenue generation plans, to enable the company to meet its liabilities as they fall due for at least twelve months from the date of approval of the financial statements. The board believe, having considered the current and projected trading cash flows and cost containment initiatives, that the company will have adequate funds to meet its liabilities for at least twelve months from the date of approval of the financial statements and that it is appropriate for the financial statements to be prepared on a going concern basis.

**5. Post-Balance Sheet Events**

There have been no significant events affecting the company since the financial year-end.

**6. Approval of financial statements**

The financial statements were approved and authorised for issue by the board of directors on 12 February 2026.
